ARRL VEC examination fee to rise

Starting January 1, the fee charged all applicants at ARRL VEC-coordinated Amateur Radio test sessions will increase from \$10 to \$12 for the year 2003. This fee is charged to anyone applying for a new amateur license or upgrading their operating privileges. Applicants failing an exam element at ARRL sessions where examiners permit retesting on the same exam element also must submit a retest fee of \$12. Additionally, the maximum reimbursement ARRL VEC allows ARRL volunteer examiner (VE) teams to retain to directly offset their prudently incurred out-of-pocket expenses will increase from \$4 to \$6 in 2003 (this fee has remained at \$4 per person served since 1991). "While the number of examinees has remained relatively unchanged in the past 24 months, our cost of doing business—and the expenses incurred by ARRL VEs—continues to rise," said ARRL VEC Manager Bart Jahnke, W9JJ. "An adjustment was needed in the 2003 test fee if we intended to maintain the same level of service that our VEs and VE teams have come to expect." Jahnke said that adjusting the reimbursement level for ARRL VEs who retain a portion of the fees to offset their out-of-pocket, exam-related expenses was also past due. Poptronics ceases publication:

Poptronics magazine—which evolved from the former Popular Electronics and Electronics Now magazines ceased publication with the January 2003 edition (Vol 4, No 1). "After 94 years of publishing electronics magazines Gernsback Publications is no longer in operation," said Larry Steckler, Poptronics' editor in chief and publisher. "Negotiations are under way to provide an alternative publication to *Poptronics* subscribers." Steckler says a new on-line edition of Poptronics will soon be available. Poptronics Interactive, a separate on-line, paid subscription site announced in the October issue of Poptronics, also is scheduled to return soon, Steckler said. The company plans to post the latest information on its Web site http:// www.poptronics.com/>. The site has been undergoing "remodeling," but Steckler

said it should be back in

operation by the end of Janu-

ary. Many veteran amateurs

Propagation Forecast Bulletin 2 ARLP002

After last week's big drop in activity, sunspots are back. The average sunspot number for this week was over twice what it was last week, and average daily solar flux was up over 32 points. Solar flux is expected to rise over the next few days, to 190 on Saturday, 195 on Sunday, and peaking on Monday around 200. But helioseismic images show no major spots on the sun's far side. Right now we are inside a weak solar wind. and geomagnetic indices have been quiet since last Friday and Saturday. The planetary A index has been in the single digits, but is expected to rise slightly to 15 on Friday, and then drop back again. The recent variation in solar activity shows that there is still life in this sunspot cycle, although over time we should expect a downward trend. We

have passed the longest night of the year, and this is a good season for low band work on 160 and 80 meters, particularly when K and A index values are low. As the days get longer, higher bands will improve as we head toward the spring equinox. Sunspot numbers for January 2 through 8 were 74, 108, 117, 128, 141, 199, and 198, with a mean of 137.9. 10.7 cm flux was 118.3, 137.6, 143, 148.1, 162.1, 163.2, and 173.7, with a mean of 149.4. Estimated planetary A indices were 8, 13, 13, 9, 7, 9, and 7, with a mean of 9.4.


