July 2010

We had great attendance at the June meeting and one more Whiz Bang of a Field Day at Ogden Park. With regard to Field Day a great big thanks to the large group of people who showed up on Saturday morning to help set-up and also to the large group that came Sunday afternoon to help take things down. That was a great step forward in taking care of field day. The Spaghetti dinner on Saturday night was fantastic. Julian Brad Berry and Linda Hutchison did a great job organizing the event and a number of the wives chipped in and brought some great sweet stuff to top things off. Not all the club members were there for this one and I can assure you that you missed one great meal and a great time. We had a great kick off for FD too with Mayor Saffo and County Commission Chairman Jason Thompson cutting the big red ribbon after presenting the ACARC with a very nice Proclamation of Appreciation for the services the ham radio operators in the area provide.

So performance wise how did we do? Well we doubled our QSO score from last year and compared to the year before that even much better. Our final score will be determined once the ARRL adds all of our bonus points to the QSO score. We had 514 CW QSOs and 282 SSB QSOs. Interesting that ARRL and the FCC has dropped the CW requirement from licensing – the CW station certainly out performs the SSB mode of operation. We had planned to try some digital communications, however, we were challenged enough keeping the CW, SSB and GOTA stations going that we really never got the chance to relax and try some digital work. Maybe next year if we can encourage some club members to develop the skills to operate some of the digital modes under tough conditions.

So having done so well and improved so much is there any room for further improvement? You bet there is and we learned a lot that will help us in the future if we follow through. We were not real good at executing our plan. While we had lots of help for the set-up, not many of the set-up crew had studied the FD plan and knew what all had to be done to get things going. We were an hour and a half late getting everything operational. We missed some easy bonus opportunities because we did not do some upfront work effectively. Operating efficiency needs a boost especially with computer based logging experience and proficiency and with SSB operating skills. There is just much, much more to FD than 2A NC. But our performance trend is in the right direction. We just need to work on some things and get better at them. Club programs and club activities can go a long way toward improvement provided members support the effort.

In the Activity Calendar I have listed a lot of upcoming State QSO Parties. I strongly encourage you to think about getting set up and operate in them and see what you can do. They are real low key events that are great for learning some new skills without all the pressure of big contests and they are fun too. You can even qualify for awards in most of them. Look on the ARRL page or Google the QSO Party name to get a link to the rules and all the information you need to plan your operations. Take an initiative to improve your operating skills beginning now.

The summer doldrums are here and band conditions normally take a bit of a slump during the summer months. There are plenty of State QSO Parties in August and these provide great opportunities to learn operating skills without a lot of pressure. People are also off on vacations and all kinds of other activities. But don't forget we do have a July meeting and Jack Jacobs, WD4OIN is planning a very interesting program on County Hunting. County hunting is quite challenging and represents another of those activity niches which can provide many hours of fun and entertainment on HF radio. Make our plans to attend the July meeting.
