October 2010

The September meeting was great and it was nice to see all the faces there and hear of all the ham radio activity during the past month. We had some good discussion during the program on antennas and feed lines. We still have a couple of good programs left for the balance of the year and of course the Christmas Party and hopefully most of the members are planning on participating.

Now I need to turn your attention to an important subject and that is the subject of **CLUBMANSHIP** – what it means to be a member of a club. Being a club member falls into two classifications – those in **LEADERSHIP** and those in **FOLLOWERSHIP**. Those in leadership lead the club in accordance with the purpose of the club and in a way that all members have an equal opportunity to participate. Some people seem to think the leadership does all the work but this is false and treating the leadership in this manner by the membership tends to runaway the good leadership. Followership means supporting the leadership and supporting the other members by participation in club meetings, club functions and in general ham radio. So as a member you let your fellow members down when you do not participate in club activities. Each of you have only 3 more opportunities in 2010 to support your fellow members, two meetings and the Christmas Party – failing to attend lets your fellow members down! The current nominating committee is having a difficult if not impossible time finding people to fill the ballot for the leadership positions for 2011 and the general reason stated is that they feel the membership will leave them holding the bag.

November is the meeting for elections and this is a very important meeting for the whole membership – not a handful of members, so plan now to attend. As we think about leadership lets look at the positions and their responsibilities. PRESIDENT – Presides over club meetings, represents the club as the club official and sees that the offices of leadership perform their functions so every club member has an equal opportunity to participate. VICE PRESIDENT – Responsible to oversee (not perform) the activities of the club such as Field Day, Battleship events, light house operations, club meeting programs, etc. and fills in for the President when they can not be present. SECRETARY – Takes care of the records of the club and records the minutes of the meetings. TREASURER – Maintains the financial resources of the club, prepares a budget for the club each year and controls the expenditures of the club in accordance with the budget and the votes of the club. So the leadership keeps the club functioning but the club is what the membership does not what the leadership does. If any of you are interested in any of these jobs please contact Bill Usher, Chairman of the Nominating Committee and let your desires be known so that committee can consider all potential candidates.

There are two very important other positions that are not elected but must be filled each year to serve the club. Those include the Webmaster (Jack, WD4OIN) and the Newsletter Editor (currently unfilled but published by the President).

In 2011 we need more FOLLOWERSHIP. Typically the best part of each meeting is when club members introduce themselves and talk about their ham radio activities in the past

month. If you don't come to a club meeting and participate you cheat your fellow club members by not sharing and you yourself are cheated because you don't get to share in what others are reporting. We can use people who will share in Newsletter articles and club programs. Many have the capability to contribute significantly but are holding back. We need much, much more participation in club events such as Field Day, Battleship Operations, Lighthouse Activities, Boy Scouts, etc. So as we close out 2010 and begin 2011 I would like to see each member pledge to increase their FOLLOWERSHIP.
