EYE-CATCHER!!! Well, it has been a few years since the last landfall. At 5:00 AM EDT this morning (8/27/11), the center of Hurricane Irene was located at 29.3 N 77W. The City of Wilmington is at 34N 77W. Irene at 5:00 AM was 420 miles SSW of Cape Hatteras moving due North at 14 MPH. Maximum sustained winds were 110 MPH (Category II) and the National Weather Service reports that re intensification is possible as She approaches landfall.Hurricane force winds (74-110 MPH for Cat I & II, 110+ MPH for a Major Hurricane) extend outwards 90 miles from the center, and Tropical storm Force winds 290 miles. Minimal Central Pressure was 942.

As of Thursday afternoon, the East coast from Little River, NC to Sandy Hook NJ is under a Hurricane Warning. According to the NWS, "A Hurricane Warning means that Hurricane conditions are expected somewhere in the Warning Area" within 36 hours. The Hurricane Watch Net (14.235MHz) will most probably activate this morning. The web site contains much useful Hurricane info, as does that of the NWS. The NWS Tropical Prediction Center provides excellent graphics. The New Hanover County and State of North Carolina web sites also provide useful guidance.

Outdoor preparations should be completed today, and if you "riding it out", food, water, batteries, and First Aid supplies should be laid in. Batteries intended to power amateur radio gear should be recharged today, as should equipment and antenna systems.

The 8:00AM update from NWS states that the center of Irene is at 30.0N 77.3W, moving due North (360 Degrees) at 14 MPH, 375 miles SSW of Cape Hatteras. Except for the change of location and a slight increase in Minimum Central pressure up 3 to 945MB, all else remains the same as in the 5:00AM report. The NWS further advises as follows:

"On the forecast track...the core of the Hurricane will pass well off the coast of Northeastern Florida today...approach the coast of North Carolina tonight...and pass near or over the North Carolina coast Saturday...Some re-intensification is possible today...and Irene is expected to be near the threshold between Category two and three as it reaches the North Carolina coast."
