

First a Brief History • First Field Day was introduced by the ARRL in June of 1933 • The objective was to showcase Ham's skills in setting up "portables" in the 'field'. • The telephone system of the day was easily disrupted. Ham Radio was often times the only means of communication with the outside world during emergencies. • The 1933 Field Day winner was W4PAW, James Chafin of Tampa Florida. W4PAW made 62 QSOs, and had 28 sections for a total of 1876 points. • Except for WWII, Field Day has been held every year since inception. • Tens of thousands of Hams in North America participate. • It is considered by many to be the premier on-air event of the Ham Radio Calendar.









We did discuss Field Day 2020 and if the club was going to participate. IF social-distancing restrictions are adequately lifted before then then the club will be there in Ogden Park as scheduled. Much more will be discussed with club members in the coming couple of months.

Field Day 2020

If....if....we are still socially isolated in June and cannot hold a club-level Field Day as planned do not despair. You can still participate from home.

The rules set by the ARRL for Field Day do allow operation from home – even on regular commercial electric power from your radio in the house. For example, let's cover a couple of scenarios for operating at home if the Ogden Park event is cancelled.

1. Single operator at home running on emergency power like a battery or a generator: this is Class E station according to the rules. Take this set up away from home for the day and you are now a Class B.

2. Single operator at home running on standard commercial power: this is a Class D station.

Don't take my word for it...explore the rules for yourself here because I probably read them wrong somehow:

6 Meters – The Magic Band

It's getting that time of year again when 6 meters will come alive. Most modern transceivers have 6 meters on them. All you need is to hook-up and antenna and go for it.

Collecting grid squares is the name of the game on six meters and we live near a very rare one. FM13. It starts about the stop light in Kure Beach and runs south. Most of FM13 is in the ocean, but a very small portion is on the Brunswick County side of the river, right at the Ferry dock near Southport. If you think about it there's not much land mass in FM13 and no Hams permanently live there, so it makes for a good day putting the grid on the air. I have camped at the Ft Fisher Recreational area during the June ARRL VHF QSO party, ARRL Field Day, July CQ Magazine World Wide VHF Contest and September VHF contests for that specific purpose. I have also just driven down there and parked either at the Ferry landing or some other area to put FM13 on the air.

Modes used on 6 meters:

Beacons: 50.000 to 50.080

CW: below 50.100

SSB: 50.100 to around 50.200 with 50.110 DX Call calling frequency, and 50.125 Domestic Call Frequency, establish a contact on the calling frequency then move off.

Digital: 50.313 FT8

50.318 FT4

50.280 MFSK 144 calling frequency

AM: 50.400

Just listening doesn't make any contacts! Get on there and call CQ, be relentless don't give up. Right now the most popular is 50.313 for FT8, activity most of the time.

For 6 meters, antennas are relatively small. And can be built easily and cheaply. Some antenna build and general information links for you to explore:
